



It's an 800 gallon system—fish only with live rock and soft corals.

Modular custom 3 sump filtration system. Mechanical filtration by filter socks, foam blocks and (2) S-300 Eshopps cone skimmers. Biological filtration achieved by live rock and (2) Bubble Magus bio pellet reactors. Chemical filtration by rowaphos and carbon via (2) 4L media reactors.

System is fully controlled by a Neptune Apex system. Dos/DDR system to supplement alkalinity and calcium. Separate DOS for auto water changes (changes out 10 gallons per day). 3 WAV pumps for added circulation. Float switches and leak detection sensors to alert of any potential water leakage or abnormal sump levels. 114 watt Aqua UV sterilizer for water clarity and reduced fish disease. In a remote room there is a total of 300 gallons of water on hand for the auto water change system and for back up. (2) Spectrapure reverse osmosis filters; 1 for the aquarium evaporation and 1 for auto water change system. Lighting is provided by 6 AI hydra 52HD's. Return pumps are 2 Ecotech Vectra L1's. Heavily stocked with fish, eels, 2 stingrays and a baby stingray that was born in the aquarium.

Tank 3—29 gallon all in one nano cube, currently cycling for a seahorse only tank, has some macro algae and cleanup crew currently







Stared in January 2017. Solar Powered Custom built 400 Gal Island Mix Reef, 600 gal total system. Over 70 fish and inverts with 75 different spices of coral. Tank has all 4 sides visible glass with PVC bottom. Reeflo Hammerhead Return Pump with (2) 1-1/2" Sea Swirls with custom nozzles. Neptune Apex controlled auto feeders dry and liquid. Closed loop electrical controlled solenoid and dosing pump for tank water through refrigerator to keep liquid foods from spoiling. Powered by Reeflo Dart Pump & Oceans Motions Flow Diverter with flow educators. 3" pipe overflow drains custom epoxy textured and painted. Emergency overflow drain with electrical in same pipe with alarm. Custom light hanging system on rolling track with swing away rods for (3) Kessil AP700 Led lights with storm mode and sound. Hidden 1-1/2 pipe for eel and critters to live in. Also pipes under sand bed for pistol shrimps and gobies to live in. Custom plumbed sand bed cleaning siphoning system with fill & drain. Custom built wood nautical facade top and bottom with removable panels. Sump is plumbed down one level and 25 feet away. Sump/Storage Room with sink and DI water rinse faucet. Plumbed in 100 gal RODI water tank and filter system with drain going to outside trees. Custom built sump with help of (Awesome Dude) Dave Anderson. Plumbed-in system Mixing Station with pump, air, heat, temp probe and drain. Reef Octopus Dual Chamber Calcium Reactor with electronic Co2 regulator with drain and Apex flow meter. (2) Dual Stage BRS GFO/Carbon Reactors with plumbed in rinse system. Auto dosing Alk, Cal, Mag when needed for the upcoming Apex Trident Monitoring System. Protein skimmer with drain and alarm with auto shut off. Refugium with 3 different algae. Sump has removable panels for expansion in sump frag tank when needed. Underwater frag LED lights with Kessil H380 Grow Algae light. More Marine Pure blocks than you have ever seen utilizing both ways of use, with Miracle Mud. 80 Watt UV Sterilizer with custom clean out drain. Apex ATK Auto Top Off System. Plumbed-in sump acclimation drip system. Plumbed in QT with drain & Seneye Reef Monitoring. Everything has overflow drains and leak detectors—20 in all. Dedicated mini washing machine for filter sock cleaning.

From Salt Lake: Take I-15 South to the 13800 S Exit and exit left. Follow Bangerter Parkway up the hill until you reach the Highland Drive stoplight with a Chevron and 7-11 on either corner. Continue straight through the light, immediately get in the right lane, and take your second right onto Nechatel Dr where you'll see the sign for "Traverse Chateau". House will be on the left side with a Dory stuck in the lawn.

From Utah County: Take I-15 North to the 14600 S Exit and exit right. Follow Highland Drive to the Bangerter Parkway stop-light and turn right. My tank is a 72 gal. Bow front.

Lighting: 2 Kessil 360's ran on a controller ramping color and intensity up then back down throughout the day.

Filtration: Canister filter. I run carbon in case an anemone gets sucked in a circulation pump.

I also employ a phosphate remover pad in the filter.

Circulation: 2 pumps.

Inhabitants: Soft corals, gorgonians, Tangs, pigmy angels, Mandarin, clown fish, chromis, many rock flower anemones, anemone crabs, cleaner shrimps, and reef janitors.

Directions: One way is to go south on the Bacchus highway follow the curve and now you will find yourself going east. Keep going until Rosecrest dr. Main show tank is 210 gallons with a basement fish room total volume is close to 400 gallons. Have QT systems as well for fish and coral separate from each other. Over 75 SPS corals and a few Acans and other corals.

Fish: 1 Gem Tang, 2 Black Tangs, 3 Purple Tangs, 1 Yellow Tang, 1 Desjarni Tang, 1 Blue Face Angel, Anthias and a pair of Golden Dwarf Eels

The tank has been only been running since March but is looking good and so are the inhabitants.

Take 800 N in Orem (east) and head to the base of Provo Canyon. Head south off of 800 N onto University Ave. Two stop lights ahead will be Foothill Dr. Turn left (east) onto Foothill. Go through the next light which is Canyon Drive. Follow the road until you come to Windsor. Take a left on Windsor (east). Then it's the next left. Hillside Drive straight into the cul-de-sac which is Brentwood Circle.
